With some 360,000 net acres in Oklahoma and the Texas Panhandle, Range Resources Corp. is actively developing its Mississippi Lime/Chat potential in Kay and Cowlitz counties on the Nemaha Ridge, making wells that produce more than 50% oil. Also, its work in the Woodford, Granite Wash and the St. Louis Lime, which it proved horizontally in 2011, bring its Midcontinent resource potential to as much as 9 Tcfe.
